## Subj: January 2022VP of Comp Report

- Congratulations to the seven (7) teams from NSYSA Clubs that continued to WYS Recreation Cup Semi Finals. The competition was tough and the teams represented NSYSA well.
- The season ended with a 10-game season. Although <u>Covid</u> made its presence known. We completed the season with only a few games being impacted.
- I would like to hold a post season meeting and discuss lessons learned and possible changes.
  - a. Team bracketing was impacted by melding age groups to create competitive grouping.
  - b. How are we going to coordinate High School team scheduling?
  - c. Could we consider a 1 game in 8 game schedule?
- Judging on some of the comments in coaches reports indicate there was more angst in some games than we want to be a part of our games.
  - a. We need to review our "Respect" program.
  - b. Expectations and Codes of Conduct need to be looked at.
  - c. No reported misconducts reflect the number of reported actions through 'Coaches Report.'
- 5. Coach's Reports, what is their purpose?
  - a. How many reports had no relationship to the game and the play?
  - b. But rather it was a; 'He said She said.
  - c. And most often each coach's report was an exact opposite of the opponent.
  - d. In an era of "WYS Respect Program," how can this be happening?

- 6. Many of the teams have expressed concern for the lack of referees for our games.
  - a. First, I would like to thank all the volunteers that have stepped and allowed the game to be played.
  - b. Just a reminder, they are volunteer referees. May not always be what the crowd wants, but they are out there trying and deserve the respect.
- NSYSA will host a Zoom meeting on 13 January with all Clubs, Kitsap Peninsula Soccer Referee Association, and possibly the Washington Soccer Referee Administration.
  - The purpose will be to discuss possible actions guided towards the generating greater numbers of referees.
  - b. We need to allow coaches to coach and parents to watch their team play.
  - c. We can only do this by strengthening our numbers of referees.
- 8. We must look at the way we sponsor USSF Soccer Referee training. We have known for some time that our referee group is growing older. And our numbers are falling. We, as an Association, need to look at our needs and find ways to increase our referee pool.
- 9. How many games went without USSF Referee coverage?
  - a. Of those games how many were three-man teams?
  - b. I estimate that there were over 200 games without USSF Referees.
  - c. How many coaches could not coach their team because they needed to referee the game?
  - How many parents could not enjoy their child's game because they volunteered to referee.
  - e. Worst of all, how many of those games did the coaches, players, and spectators disrespect their volunteer efforts.
- 10. What are some of the reasons we never have enough referees?
  - a. Is it always someone else's job to find that person?
  - b. Do the coaches, players, and spectators demonstrate the respect and appreciation necessary?
  - c. Why sit 'OK' to be ugly?



- 11. How do we get the zing back?
  - a. Who has the responsibility to lead?
  - b. For those coaches that want a referee; I ask them, how many referees has your Club produced and are now officiating games?
  - c. What is your Club's plan to find and recruit referees?
- I have sent a mailing to Washington State Referee asking for assistance and direction to bring our referee numbers to responsible levels.
  - a. What is the ratio of adult to youth referees?
  - b. How do we find and recruit them?
  - c. How do we retain these new referees?
- 13. What does it take to tame the beast?
  - a. How do we make those that disrespectful know the damage of their actions?
  - b. How do we teach coaches to use their practice to guide responsible play?
  - c. How do we define responsible play?
- I would like to target the April May time frame to hold training and prepare new referees.
  - Summer tournaments are a fine time to advantage the fine tuning and mentoring of new referees.
  - b. We must prepare them and make them ready for the Fall season.

# **NSYSA** Constitution



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# Article 1. Name and Duration.

**Section A** - The "Northwest Sound Youth Soccer Association", hereinafter referred to alternatively as "NSYSA" or "Association", is a non-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Washington.

Section B - The duration of this Corporation shall be perpetual.

# Article 2. Objectives and Purpose.

Section A. The objectives of the NSYSA are to:

- 1. Promote and further develop the game of soccer.
- 2. Organize and govern the game of soccer for youth within portions of Kitsap, Mason, and Jefferson counties within the state of Washington.
- 3. Assign administrative responsibilities to member organizations.
- 4. Establish uniform rules and regulations applicable to youth soccer competition in this Association consistent with the principles and laws of the Federal International de Football Association (FIFA, the world governing body for soccer), those of the United States Soccer Federation (USSF, the national governing body of soccer, affiliated with FIFA), and those of the Washington Youth Soccer (WYS).
- 5. Provide programs for the membership as required.
- 6. Administer and conduct Association competitions as required.
- 7. Represent this Association in all matters of organized youth soccer regarding Washington Youth Soccer and interested parties.
- 8. Where conditions and circumstances prevent full compliance, the Association shall affect deviation best Suited to its own needs.

Section B. The purpose of NSYSA is educational an include the following:

- 1. Teach and train players, coaches, and other adult members.
- 2. Teach through the game of soccer, sportsmanship, physical health, and mental alertness.
- 3. Operate exclusively as an exempt organization within the meaning and limits of section 501(c)(3).

# Article 3. Association Colors and Boundaries.

Section A. The representative colors of the NSYSA will be blue/green/white.

- 1. The jersey/shorts/alternative jersey colors of affiliated clubs of this Association shall be:
  - i. Bainbridge Island Soccer club
  - ii. Bremerton Soccer Club
  - iii. Central Kitsap Soccer Club
  - iv. JC Soccer Club

Blue/White/Black Blue/White Red/Black/ White Black/Teal

- v. North Kitsap Soccer Club
- vi. North Mason youth Soccer Club
- vii. South Kitsap Soccer Club
- viii. Tracyton Soccer Club
- ix. Kitsap Alliance FC

Section B. The boundaries of NSYSA will be:

- 1. Bainbridge Island, Bremerton, Central Kitsap, North Kitsap, and South Kitsap School Districts within Kitsap County;
- 2. Port Townsend, Chimacum, Quilcene, and Brinnon School Districts within Jefferson County;
- 3. North Mason school district within North Mason County within the state of Washington.

# Article 4. Jurisdiction

**Section A.** The NSYSA shell have jurisdiction over all the member organizations including clubs, teams, as well as associated individuals, such as players, coaches, and administrators.

# Article 5. Affiliation

Section A. The NSYSA shall be a member of Washington Youth Soccer.

# **Article 6. Financial Policy**

**Section A.** The NSYSA Is and shall be a nonprofit organization. Each member club desiring its own separate nonprofit status (registered charitable organization) must obtain it independently from the state of Washington (Olympia) and the Internal Revenue Service.

# **Article 7. Administrative Authority**

**Section A.** The NSYSA Board of Directors shall be governed by the NSYSA Constitution and Bylaws except when these are superseded by those of Washington Youth Soccer.

**Section B.** The NSYSA shall have the authorization from time to time to issue policies or instructions necessary to interpret, clarify, or further define the constitution, bylaws, procedures, and rules.

# Article 8. Membership

**Section A.** The membership of the NSYSA shall consist of incorporated and unincorporated organizations engaged in youth soccer within the Association Boundaries (see definition in Article 3, Section B), which agree to be bound by the Constitution, Bylaws, procedures, and rules of the NSYSA and which shall be admitted to membership in accordance with the Bylaws of NSYSA.

# Article 9. Administration

**Section A.** The governing authority of the NSYSA shall be vested in the Association Board of Directors.

**Section B.** The Association Executive Board of Directors shall be composed of a President, First Vice-President of Administration, Vice President of Competition, Vice President of Awards and Recognition, Secretary, Treasurer, and Registrar.

**Section C**. The Association Board of Directors shall be composed of the Association Executive Board of Directors, and one representative each from the Clubs which are members of the Association.

# **Article 10. Meetings**

**Section A.** The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of all members of the NSYSA shall be held for the primary purpose of the election of officers and consideration of proposed amendments to this Constitution, and proposed resolutions. The AGM shall be held as provided in Article V of the NSYSA Bylaws.

**Section B.** All other meetings, including but not limited to meetings of the Association Board of Directors, shall be held as provided in Article V of the NSYSA Bylaws.

**Section C.** Voting at all NSYSA meetings shall take place as provided in Article V of the NSYSA Bylaws.

# Article 11. Parliamentary Authority

**Section A.** all meetings of the NSYSA shall be conducted using the current edition of "Roberts Rules of Order" as a guide.

# Article 12. Amendments

**Section A.** Proposed changes or amendments to this constitution can only be affected at the annual general meeting (AGM).

**Section B.** such proposed changes or amendments can be made by member clubs or elected officers of this Association and must be submitted in writing to the NSYSA secretary no later than 30 days prior to the NSYSA AGM.

**Section C.** The NSYSA Secretary shall notify each member club at least 30 days prior to the AGM by mailing out such proposed changes or amendments to this Constitution. To be approved, the amendment must pass by a majority vote 3/4 of the Association Board of Directors in attendance at the AGM.

**Section D.** All approved changes or amendments shall be included in the AGM minutes.

# Article 13. Books, Records, and Accounting

**Section A.** The Association shall maintain adequate and correct accounts, books, and records of its business and properties. All such books, records, and accounts shall be kept by the officer directed as responsible. All records shall be open to inspection by the NSYSA board of directors when requested.

**Section B. Dissolution:** Should NSYSA be dissolved, all monetary assets remaining after payment of all debts, shall be turned over to any remaining member clubs which have qualified under Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code and shall be divided proportionally to the average number of registered Washington Youth Soccer players over the previous three years. Physical assets shall be held in trust by remaining Member Clubs.
